Highmark Announces New Program

Memorial Hospital’s White Rose Hospice is a participating provider in Highmark’s new Advanced Illness Services (AIS) Program for members of their Medicare Advantage plans. The AIS program is intended to offer quality of care for members with progressive, life-limiting illness and provides 100 percent coverage for up to 10 outpatient care visits by an AIS network provider.

Under the program, AIS network hospice and/or palliative care physicians, nurses, social workers and/or home health aides can visit patients for whom their physician attests that death could occur within one year. The services are primarily consultative including controlling pain and symptoms, providing emotional support and facilitating decision-making related to care and coordination of services.

Patients with diseases such as cancer, heart disease, end-stage lung or kidney disease, stroke or advanced frailty would all be candidates for the program. Patients may receive these services within a health care facility or their home. There are no requirements to be homebound or to meet a skilled level of care to be eligible. There is a lifetime limit of 10 visits over an unlimited period. A physician’s authorization is required. Patients may continue to receive curative and other covered services available through the health plan.

Protect Patient Privacy

Please share these HIPAA reminders with anyone in your practice who has access to patient information:

- Having access to patient information is a necessity to perform your job. However, this privilege is only to perform the functions of your job and not for personal use.
- It is not acceptable to look up your own records, or a family member's records, in the computer system. When records or results are needed, please contact your physician or sign an authorization with the hospital correspondence department to obtain copies through proper channels.
- Sharing passwords is never acceptable. Do not post passwords on your computer or badge. Create a unique password that you can remember.
- Always log off computers. Place paper files in secure locations; do not make these accessible to the public.
- Hold periodic privacy and security training for all of your associates—usually once a year at a minimum.

Please Note: If you have remote access to the Memorial Hospital computer system in your office, please be sure to notify us when someone no longer works for your practice so that we can de-activate the account. Please call Bonnie Duncan at 849-5573 for assistance.

CMS Changes Regulations

New regulations from The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) for patients receiving home health or hospice care require physicians to provide documented information of a face-to-face encounter with a patient before signing the certification for the home health plan of care. As of January 1, 2011, CMS requires this encounter to take place within 90 days prior to, or within 30 days of, the start of home health services. For hospice care, the new regulations require that the hospice medical director have a face-to-face visit with a hospice patient prior to them entering into the third certification (or prior to 180 days into their benefit). This information is required to be on a separate form available from Memorial's Home Health Services office.


Nicotine Support Group
